#### SESSION UPDATE

Clerk's Corner

The Session met on August 20, 2024. The Session "took the Summer off" kinda, but they met throughout the summer months to read and discuss *Canoeing the Mountains* by Tod Bolsinger. Using the Lewis and Clark expedition as a metaphor, the author discussed what happens when the map ends, and one must travel off the map because all the old realities no longer apply. The Session discussed the implications of what this calls them to as leadership of the First Presbyterian Church of Youngstown. We will celebrate 225 years of existence on September 1<sup>st</sup>. Then what?

In addition to visioning the future, the Session had a full agenda. The record noted the death of Terry Murray on June 11, 2024, with his memorial service on July 20<sup>th</sup>. Helen Kalfas was not a member, but she and her family attended for many years. The memorial service for Helen was held on July 30. Also noted was the death on June 7, 2024, of Barbara Kaminsky, the wife of former pastor, the Rev. David Kaminsky. The Session celebrated that Emily Slaven transferred her letter, and Janie and Monty Warner asked to become members of FPCYO -- Session unanimously agreed. This raises our membership to 128. The Session also recorded the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism of Emma Marie Culp, granddaughter of Emily Slaven, on August 4, 2024.

Due to the declining membership, the Session decreased the size of the church officers, with Session and the Board of Deacons being reduced to 6 members. With vacancies in classes of both boards, as they start their search, the Nominating Committee will look for individuals who are called to leadership roles with the understanding that attendance at monthly meetings is mandatory, as well as attendance, leadership and participation on two standing committees.

There is a lot of maintenance happening in the building. The church school room has been painted and new carpet will be installed and we are working to receive estimates for major repairs to our boiler and HVAC systems. The Finance Committee reported that our investments continue to grow with the swings of the stock market, but the budget next year will need modifications. Finance and BEG need to look toward grants from foundations which might address needed repairs to major systems in the church building. BEG wants to have a valuation done of the property. Additionally, there will be purchases of new computers, internet wiring and capabilities, and printers. Session approved purchasing equipment and installation of a new phone system.

Finally, there was sadness during Elsie Dursi's report from the August 13, 2024 meeting of Eastminster Presbytery with the news that our sister church, Gibson Heights Presbyterian Church, is closing. The only churches left in the City of Youngstown are the Hungarian Presbyterian Church and us – a sobering close to the meeting. The next meeting of Session will be September 17, 2024 at 7 p.m.



## FPC Book Club Tuesday, September 10, 2024 at 10 A.M.





## Westhuizen Duo

#### Pierre and Sophié van der Westhuizen, pianos

The Westhuizen Duo's performances have been described as "... music-making that rewards you seventy times seven." They have been hailed by audiences and critics alike for their "... excellent sensitivity for each other," combined with playing that is "... charming, lyrical, and brilliant..." (Volksblad, South Africa).

Their performances have been heard on WCLV (Cleveland), ClassicFm (South Africa), Radio Sonder Grense (SA), WGTE (Toledo), WYSU, and WFMT (Chicago). Their interest in new music has led to premiere performances of works written



for the duo by young composers, and they enjoy taking part in new music festivals. Highlights include performances and guest teaching at major South African festivals, as well as others in the USA such as Dame Myra Hess Memorial Concert Series in Chicago (broadcast live on NPR and PBS Television), Baldwin-Wallace Conservatory's Bach Festival, Cleveland Institute of Music's <u>Summer Sonata</u> Festival, Gilmore Keysfest, College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati, <u>Colorado International Piano Festival</u>, Chautauqua Piano Institute, Kent State University Keyboard Series, and Cleveland Art Song Festival, among others. They also made their New York debut at Steinway Hall in 2017.



Pierre has served as juror for several international competitions, including the Cleveland, Scriabin (Italy), MozArte (Germany), and UNISA (South Africa), and serves on the boards of the Yun Foundation (Philadelphia) and Magistera Soloists (Canada), as well as the Honorary Committee for Astral Artists (Philadelphia) and the Advisory Board for the Avery Fisher Career Grants in New York.

The Westhuizen Duo resides in Kalamazoo, MI, where Pierre is the Executive and Artistic Director of the Gilmore International Piano Festival and Award. Prior to this, he served as President of the Cleveland International Piano Competition (CIPC). Sophié joined the faculty of Kalamazoo College, and maintains a private teaching studio. In the summer she teaches at Interlochen Arts Camp. She was Director of ArtsConnect, the community outreach program for the CIPC, and also taught at Cleveland State University and the Cleveland Music Settlement. They both previously served on the faculty of Heidelberg University as Assistant Professors of Piano and Co-coordinators of the Keyboard Division.
