

SESSION UPDATE

Clerk's Corner

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Youngstown met on Tuesday, November 19, 2024. We had a first look at the proposed 2025 Budget. There are still some outstanding questions which will be addressed for the next meeting of Session.

The Session approved:

- dates for the celebration of the Sacrament of Communion for 2025. Communion will be served on the first Sunday of each month, with some months having additional dates for significant liturgical days. Watch for a full calendar in your January Forecaster.
- a special called meeting of the Congregation on Sunday, December 8, 2024 after worship to hear the report of the Nominating Committee and to vote on the 2025 Terms of Call for the Pastor.
- a request from the BEG Committee for up to \$50,000.00 to replace the HVAC (air conditioning) system. The committee is researching bids now.

Rev. Warner announced that his theme for Advent this year is Joy to the World.

Arrangements are being made in January for the Session to meet and discuss where we have been for the last 225 years as the First Presbyterian Church of Youngstown, and where we are going as we vision for the future.

Session ended its time discussing where they find hope, how they share hope, and do they see hope in the church. It was a reflective way to end the meeting.

The next meeting of Session will take place on Tuesday, December 17, 2024 at 7 p.m.



Volunteers Needed



CHRISTMAS POINSETTIAS


