# **REFLECTION FOR WORSHIP**

The following scriptures and reflection are provided for meditation as we prepare for worship.

Isaiah 11:1-10, Psalm 72, Romans 15:4-13 and Matthew 3:1-15

**Reflection on Isaiah 11:1-10:** With or without us, God will accomplish a new creation. Having raised up the righteous leader, the Creator will make a new paradise of the earth. Enter the animals. Imagine – baby goats are best friends with grizzlies; a lamb and a wolf enjoy conversing over a breakfast of clover. Imagining such unlikely friendships between ex-predators and prey invites a little fun, but we should guard against getting too cute. The text has its eye on the deadly aggressions and fears that sicken the world, the ending of which can be envisioned only in a far-future tense. A thoroughly healed creation is imagined, nothing less than Eden remade. We notice that there is not much of a human presence in it – only a few little children are there.
