From the Pastor's Desk

Happy Spring!

This season seems to be a near perfect model for my message throughout Lent. We must exist in the tension between different poles or extremes. For our spring conditions it is the extremes of high and low temperature and sunny and stormy weather. I appreciate the complexity of creation, but my head and sinuses are not appreciating it being 70 and rainy one day and 30 and sunny 36 hours later.

Our sermons are a bit more complex, and have looked at living in between points such as stranger & neighbor, faith & works, rest & growth, and lost & found. We will close out this season with sermons on righteousness & mercy, shouting & silence, power & humility, and grief & hope.

As we live our lives, we will live on a sliding scale between all these positions. Sometimes we will be more lost than found or need more rest than active growth, and other times we will be in a different place. That is okay. Our calling is to listen to the Spirit, follow Christ, and love God the Father in every season, wherever we may be between any of those points.

As we look toward the closing of the Lenten season and we approach the high point of Easter morning, and the season of Easter that follows, may we offer grace to ourselves, our fellow believers, and the people that surround us. May we find space for our own existence in the midst of everything going on, while also looking for the people struggling to find themselves in the tension between all these different points and offering the grace, mercy, and love of Christ as they find some sort of equilibrium.

SESSION UPDATE

Clerk's Corner

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Youngstown met on Tuesday, March 18, 2025. There has been a change in the keynote speaker for the Schaff Lecture. The new presenter is Dr. Jennifer Carner, a visiting professor of preaching at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. She will lead the workshop entitled "The Enduring Power of the Folk Homiletic & Ethic in the Practice of African American Preaching." The workshop will be from 2-4 p.m. for clergy, dinner at 5 p.m., and a worship service open to the public starting at 6:30 p.m.

There was action taken to welcome more people to assist during Communion. There was a request from a Scout with Troop #55 for his Eagle Scout Project at First Youngstown. 

The food will be donated to Protestant Family Service to assist with their food pantry. **THANK YOU FOR YOUR HELP!**




MISSION COINS REMINDER

Our selection for April is a Nonfiction – *The Spy and the Traitor: The Greatest Espionage Story of the Cold War* by Ben McIntyre. This book is a story of Oleg Gordievsky, the Russian whose secret work helped hasten the end of the Cold War. The savvy, sophisticated Gordievsky grew to see his nation's communism as both criminal and philistine. As the Cold War reached its twilight, Gordievsky helped the West turn the tables on the KGB, exposing Russian spies and helping to foil countless intelligence plots, as the Soviet leadership grew increasingly paranoid at the United States's nuclear first-strike capabilities and brought the world closer to the brink of war.

MAY – Historical Fiction – *The Women: A Novel* by Kristen Hannah. In 1965, Francis "Frankie" McGrath joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows her brother's path to serve in Vietnam.

JUNE – Romance – *The Paper Palace* by Miranda Cowley Hiller. A story of summer, secrets and lies. In the course of a single day on Cape Cod, one woman must make a life-changing decision that has been brewing for decades. Best Seller, Reese's BC

JULY - Biography - Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy by Eric Metaxis.

AUGUST – Young Adult Fiction – *The Last Brass Ring* by Liz Hill. Lilli Whitaker spends the summer of 1989 before her senior year with a job at a run-down amusement park, which leads to romance, new friendships, and a long-hidden family secret.

SEPTEMBER – Historical Fiction – *The Butcher: a Novel* by Joyce Carol Oates. A harrowing story based on history about Doctor Silas Weir, a gyno-psychologist at a women's asylum in the 19th century.

OCTOBER – Nonfiction – *Heartwood: The Art of Living with the End in Mind* by Barbara Becker. Becker inspires readers to live with the end in mind and proves that turning toward loss rather than away is the only true way to live life to its fullest.

NOVEMBER – Historical Fiction – *This Tender Land* by William Kent Krueger. The unforgettable story of four orphans who travel the Mississippi River on a life-changing odyssey during the Great Depression.
