From the Pastor's Desk

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

I know it is easy to think of Easter as a single day, but, in the liturgical year and through church history, Easter has a season, just like Christmas runs through Epiphany. For Easter that season runs until Pentecost.

We definitely frontload our celebrations in the liturgical calendar, and this can bring up the question of where do we go from here? We started the Church year with Advent and Christmas, we are only 1/3 of the way through the year, and we have already "completed" Jesus's life.

We could easily jump into diving further into the stories of the Gospels. We could dive into the Epistles and look to how the teachings of Christ have been applied since the first century. Or, we could dive into the Old Testament and look at what it looks like to live in relationship with God through the ins and outs of daily life through the generations.

Even if we move in different directions for the season in worship, my suggestion for you is to spend some time this season thinking on grace and mercy. Here are some questions for you to consider over the next month.

What does the empty tomb mean for you, and for all of us? What does it mean for us to receive the grace and mercy of God? How do we live toward others when we have been the recipients of God's grace and mercy?

Clerk's Corner

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Youngstown, Ohio met on Tuesday, April 15, 2025 at 7 p.m. The following actions were approved at the meeting:


- Approval to sell maple syrup from Jane and Monroe P. Warner's trees with all proceeds going to the Mission Committee designated for Care Packages to the students at the Campus Lofts.
- Session approved Rev. Warner's participation in a fellowship with the Center for Public Justice which
 will include study and interaction with colleagues. This experience will allow Rev. Warner to explore
 old theories and learn new ones in light of his almost two years in active pastoral ministry.
- All present Ruling Elders and the Clerk signed a letter in good standing for Rev. Warner to receive state accreditation to officiate at weddings in the State of West Virginia.
- The worship services is now streaming for those unable to be in the Sanctuary on Sunday morning. A link is emailed upon request to interested worshippers.
- The offering received at the worship service at the Schaff Lecture will be donated to the Presbyterian Family Services.
- Session approved the motion from the BEG Committee to allow Dylan Mirone, a member of Scout Troop #55, to create a painted labyrinth in the center courtyard. This is Dylan's Eagle Scout Project. Session will meet next on May 20, 2025 in the Church Library at 7 p.m.



Our selection for May is a Historical Fiction – *The Women: A Novel* by Kristen Hannah. In 1965, Frances "Frankie" McGrath joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows her brother's path to serve in Vietnam. Frankie is over-whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. This story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and who sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten. A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism. It is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine who idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era.

JULY - Biography - Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy by Eric Metaxis.

AUGUST – Young Adult Fiction – *The Last Brass Ring* by Liz Hill. Lilli Whitaker spends the summer of 1989 before her senior year with a job at a run-down amusement park, which leads to romance, new friendships, and a long-hidden family secret.

SEPTEMBER – Historical Fiction – *The Butcher: a Novel* by Joyce Carol Oates. A harrowing story based on history about Doctor Silas Weir, a gyno-psychologist at a women's asylum in the 19th century.

OCTOBER – Nonfiction – *Heartwood: The Art of Living with the End in Mind* by Barbara Becker. Becker inspires readers to live with the end in mind and proves that turning toward loss rather than away is the only true way to live life to its fullest.

NOVEMBER – Historical Fiction – *This Tender Land* by William Kent Krueger. The unforgettable story of four orphans who travel the Mississippi River on a life-changing odyssey during the Great Depression.
