SESSION UPDATE

Clerk's Corner

The Session of the First Presbyterian Church of Youngstown, Ohio met on Tuesday, May 20, 2025 at 7 p.m. Session reviewed the success of the Schaff Lecture on April 23, 2025. Rev. Warner discussed his participation at CREDO, a continued education event sponsored by the PC(USA) Board of Pensions for clergy in their first years of church ministry. Session will not be having meetings during the Summer, but Elders were reminded to attend, with the rest of the congregation, the Pastor's Book Study. The first study is June 24, 2025 a 6 p.m. at the church.

The bulk of the meeting was devoted to the Building, Equipment & Grounds Committee regarding the condition and maintenance of the church building and grounds. The BEG Committee reported that with the installation of the new HVAC system, a wire fence will be put around it for security purposes. Additionally, water pipes under the Helen Chapel will need replacing, but first there needs to be asbestos removal. Bids have been received and when more information is provided by the contractors, the asbestos will be removed and repairs will be made. Finally, Ohio Living has given notice that they will end renting space at the church. They will vacate effective June 30, 2025. Session is entertaining suggestions of how to use that space on the first floor catty-corner from the Pastor's Office.

The Session will meet next on August 19, 2025 in the Church Library at 7 p.m. That does not mean the Elders are not accessible. We will be in worship, and, as always, please feel free to contact the Elders, Clerk, or Pastor with any questions or concerns.

In order to prepare for the celebration of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, the following dates have been approved by the Session:



JULY - Biography - Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy by Eric Metaxis.

AUGUST – Young Adult Fiction – *The Last Brass Ring* by Liz Hill. Lilli Whitaker spends the summer of 1989 before her senior year with a job at a run-down amusement park, which leads to romance, new friendships, and a long-hidden family secret.

SEPTEMBER – Historical Fiction – *The Butcher: a Novel* by Joyce Carol Oates. A harrowing story based on history about Doctor Silas Weir, a gyno-psychologist at a women's asylum in the 19th century.

OCTOBER – Nonfiction – *Heartwood: The Art of Living with the End in Mind* by Barbara Becker. Becker inspires readers to live with the end in mind and proves that turning toward loss rather than away is the only true way to live life to its fullest.

NOVEMBER – Historical Fiction – *This Tender Land* by William Kent Krueger. The unforgettable story of four orphans who travel the Mississippi River on a life-changing odyssey during the Great Depression.
